HINTS FOR JUDGING PROGRAM MENTORS

What an honor to be asked to become a mentor for an applicant for the Judging Program. Just in case you are not familiar with what this entails, listed below are a few hints and reminders.

The judging program rules can be found a www.cfa.org in search box type Judging Program Rules.

Mentors must be approved AB Judges and cannot mentor more than 3 applicants at any given time.

There are special sections for judges from other associations and our associate judge program.

Applicants have a time requirement prior to application, Breeders must have been actively breeding for 5 years, Exhibitors (who are not breeders) must have exhibited for 7 years. Applicants should have bred for a minimum of 3 years or exhibited for a minimum of 5 years prior to being assigned a mentor. Prior to that time questions may be answered by the Application Administrator, or the Mentor Coordinator on the Judging Program Committee.

During the time applicants are waiting for a mentor, there are several things they can be accomplishing so that they are moving in the right direction:

- A. Join a CFA club, and become active in that club
- B. Become a recognized breeder or exhibitor of their primary breed. And work on the required 10 or 15 Grand Champions/Grand Premiers required.
- C. Attend a clerking school and become a licensed clerk.

Once the mentor coordinator approves you as a mentor the following are some of the responsibilities you will have:

- A. Review the required judging book the applicant fills out and be certain it is error free (rule 2.12)
- B. Assist the applicant in selecting meaningful Breed handling experiences that will enhance their knowledge and application (rule2.11)
- C. Assist the applicant in selecting breeds for Custodial care and Exhibiting (rule 2.10)
- D. Make certain the applicant has attended a BAOS within 2 years of application submission (rule2.13)
- E. Review the applicant's application when complete prior to submission. It must be sent electronically in one file. (Rule2.2)
